Current world events make for exciting stories that also inform. Long-time peace activist Dr. Frank Romano will be our featured speaker on January 20. He is the author of *Love and Terror in the Middle East* and *Storm Over Morocco*. We will have the opportunity to hear about Romano's first-hand peace activities as well as to learn some of the essentials that lead to success in writing and publishing.

Using examples from his books, Dr. Romano will discuss incorporating literary elements such as metaphor, description, and writing that "shows" in creative nonfiction. He will also cover how to prepare a manuscript for submission and how to find a publisher.

#### **CLASSIC CRITIQUE GROUP**

This is the first entry of a new article for the WOK Newsletter concerning critique groups. The purpose of this series is to encourage others to improve their writing skills through the critique process by joining a group.

Leader: Terry Redman. Members: Annis Cassells, Ruth Smith, Richard Meeks, Joan Kerr, and Janet Skibinski.



Dana Martin, former WOK president, established the basic structure for the critique groups around 2010. Classic, the original group, was comprised of about 10 members. Today critique groups are limited to six participants. Terry Redman, Annis Cassells, Ruth Smith, Joan Kerr, and Richard Meeks were and continue to be part of the first members. Four years ago, Janet Skibinski became the final Classic

The Classics meet the second and fourth Wednesday of the month from 1:00 - 3:00 p.m. at Skibinski's home. According to the Meeks Rule, each member is encouraged to submit her/his entry by the Sunday before the meeting. That rule is occasionally stretched, according to the Skibinski addendum, to the Monday before. "Sometimes it's knowing my group is expecting a piece from me that makes me step up and produce something," Cassells said.

They follow the Critique Outline and reply to each topic with honest and thoughtful comments and suggestions. Everyone brings their critique sheets to the meeting and take turns reading what they've written. The author assumes a "fly on the wall" position. When all critiques are done, the author may or may not answer questions or make his/her own comments.

When asked how she felt about the process, Skibinski said, "I find my writing has improved immensely since joining the group. I'm more thoughtful when choosing words to convey my thoughts. I'm doing more showing than telling."

Annis answered, "We've learned about writing from reading each other's writing and listening to questions and comments. I find the questions particularly helpful."

"Being able to share what it means to try to put words on paper in a meaningful way with kindred spirits makes me feel like I'm not alone in pursuing what is really a lonely way to spend one's available time. The knowledge that in order to be a truly valued member of a writing group, one must dig deep to offer something of value in a critique, not just a casual pat on the back," Meeks said.

Joan said, "Not only do we assist and encourage one another with thoughtful and helpful critiques, but we have bonded as a group and become true friends in addition to being critique partners." Terry concludes, "Thanks to the Classics, I am a better writer and reader. Finding the friendships makes the experience richer. *Such a deal!*"
