Unless you're an as-yet-undiscovered creative writing prodigy, your work is going to need to be edited. No matter how good a writer you are, your work can always be better. Even if it's just tweaking that one adjective or adverb that really nails an emotion. You need a good editor, but there's a lot you can do on your own before spending money. As a professional editor, my job is to take your great story and make it that much better. But I can give you lots of tips do to on your own that will greatly improve your writing before you pay an editor. And you won't even need to buy your own copy of the 1,200-plus page *The Chicago Manual of Style* to master those tips.



Authors, this is a great chance to practice your pitch.


Guidelines: authors give a 40-second pitch about their book during the meeting. This activity can be used as an avenue to help authors improve their skills while advertising their work.

Alexa had never met a more exasperating man...


When English pop star Colin Radcliffe asks Alexa to write his biography and tour with him in Europe, she is thrilled—until she begins to receive death threats.








CARLIA JOY MARTIN




